Medication Name: Mycocide-X

Active Ingredient: Butenafine HCl 0.1%

What is Mycocide-X?

Mycocide-X is a topical antifungal medication used to treat athlete's foot, jock itch, and ringworm. It works by killing the fungus that causes these infections.

How should I use Mycocide-X?

Wash the affected area with soap and water and dry it thoroughly. Apply a thin layer of Mycocide-X to the affected area once a day for 2 weeks. Do not apply more than the recommended amount.

What are the possible side effects of Mycocide-X?

The most common side effects of Mycocide-X are mild and go away on their own. These side effects may include:

- Skin irritation
- Burning
- Stinging
- Rash
- Redness

If you experience any of these side effects, stop using Mycocide-X and talk to your doctor.

What should I do if I miss a dose of Mycocide-X?

Apply the missed dose as soon as you remember. Do not apply more than one dose in a day.

What should I do if I overdose on Mycocide-X?

If you think you have overdosed on Mycocide-X, call your doctor or the Poison Control Center immediately.

What should I avoid while using Mycocide-X?

Avoid getting Mycocide-X in your eyes. If it does get in your eyes, rinse them with water immediately.

What should I tell my doctor before using Mycocide-X?

Tell your doctor if you are allergic to butenafine or any other ingredients in Mycocide-X. Tell your doctor if you are pregnant or breastfeeding. Tell your doctor if you have any other medical conditions.

Keep Mycocide-X out of reach of children.

Store Mycocide-X at room temperature. Do not store it in the refrigerator or freezer.

What else should I know about Mycocide-X?

Mycocide-X is not a cure for athlete's foot, jock itch, or ringworm. It will help to relieve the symptoms, but you may still have the infection. It is important to continue using Mycocide-X for the full 2 weeks, even if your symptoms go away. This will help to prevent the infection from coming back.
